PROGRAM CHAIR'S REPORT





It is our pleasure to welcome Dr. James Nace as our John J. McPhilemy guest speaker on October 9th. Dr. Nace is a board-certified, fellowship-trained hip, knee, and shoulder preservation and reconstructive surgeon, currently working in Baltimore at the Rubin Institute for Advanced Orthopaedics.

Dr. Nace began his career as a physical therapist, but eventually pursued medical school at PCOM, where he graduated in the top 10th percentile of his class. He remained at PCOM for orthopaedic surgery residency, and then

pursued fellowship training at the Rubin Institute in Baltimore, focusing on joint preservation and reconstruction. He now serves as the Institute's Academic Director of the Center for Joint Preservation and Replacement, and as director of their fellowship program. Dr. Nace has been described as "inspiring", "gifted", and "superiorly caring" by his patients and colleagues. He'll be talking to us about the controversy surrounding the best treatment of periprosthetic joint infection, and whether a one-stage, two-stage, or 1.5-stage approach is best in consideration of scientific, clinical, technical, and societal factors.




